



Just over a week after American University celebrated the 120th anniversary of the founding of their Washington College of Law, they held a ribbon cutting ceremony for the opening of their new 8.5-acre Tenley Campus, firmly establishing the University's commitment to education and the future of the College of Law for the next century.

Featuring more than 37,000 square feet of teaching space, as well as a 5,400 square foot outdoor courtyard, the campus was planned with a student-centered approach and a philosophy of mutal respect and collaboration.
